In our culture we identify a person's rank by how many people serve them. "How many people work under you?" is a common way to quickly assess a person's importance in the work place. The goal, of course, is to have enough money or power not to serve at all. Those at the very top have butlers, maids, gardeners, chefs, chauffeurs, personal assistants, nannies--you get the idea.

Contrast this to the example of Jesus. Philippians 2:6-8 tells us that although Jesus was God, equal in nature to the Father, He willingly humbled Himself by taking on a human nature and served us by dying on the cross for our sins. The Christmas story describes Jesus stooping from His throne in heaven to come to earth as a human baby. Although He had every right to rule as King, He instead chose to be a servant (Luke 22:27).

While we find great comfort in the Christmas story, it should also challenge us. It is, after all, the story of a God who stoops down, way down, in order to meet our need. We worship a stooping Savior. How about you? Can you stoop?



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
